Chief Hospital Corpsman (Surface Warfare) Santillan's outstanding leadership and unwavering dedication as Department Leading Chief Petty Officer during USS KIDD's demanding C7F deployment and Sustainment Phase were pivotal to mission success. He expertly led a team of two officers, four chiefs, and 22 junior sailors across three divisions, supporting joint operations with CSG-1 and CSG-9 and major exercises, including RIMPAC and PACIFIC DRAGON. His leadership resulted in six advancements, six Sailor of the Quarter awards, nine Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medals, 190 PQS completions, and a 100% retention rate.

As Senior Medical Department Representative, HMC Santillan achieved a 97% medical readiness level, one of the highest in PACFLT, while managing comprehensive care for 325 sailors. His innovative approach to mental health included coordinating an embedded psychologist for underway support, facilitating 25 timely consultations, and enhancing mental health resilience across the command. Chief Hospital Corpsman Christopher Duke's exceptional leadership and dedication have significantly elevated USS PORTER's medical readiness and Sailor development. As Department Leading Chief Petty Officer, he led a diverse team of 17 Sailors, achieving multiple awards, 100% retention, and COB completion, and securing advancements through the Meritorious Advancement Program. His role as Medical Training Team (MTT) Leader resulted in the qualification of 34 Sailors in advanced first aid and six MTT members, fostering a strong culture of medical preparedness and achieving early FSO-M certification.

Chief Duke demonstrated exemplary command of the training program, leading PORTER through 15 TCCC drills, three Mass Casualty drills, and four Battle Dressing Station drills, achieving a 100% pass rate. His proactive efforts ensured 99% medical readiness during the Southern Seas 2024 deployment, where he facilitated vaccinations and dental exams for over 320 Sailors.
